Remarks of Mrs. E. G. White at the Bible School, February 6, 1890.

He has some very precious words I want to read to you: "Neither pray I for these alone (that is the disciples immediately around him), but for them also which shall believe on me through their word." That is us. That means us, Brethren. "That they may be one as thou Father art in me and I in thee, that they also may be one in us, that the world may believe that thou hast sent me." The unity and the harmony! Now, I have thought of a good many that ought to be here that are not here.

Where are Leon Smith, and Brother Ballenger, and Bro. Smith? Can't they spend an hour? Will they draw off for fear that they shall be [won]? Why not gather these men in here? And if they do not know what they are opposing at all, they will not understand. Now, brethren, where is your burden? Is it that you should get those that do not understand these things and are all the time firing in the dark against them? We know they will not come to hear, and where the Lord can impress their hearts and their minds. Can't you see that is not the way for man to work?

Now, brethren, let us look at these matters in the right light. If we have precious things, we want they should have it, we want they should understand where the Spirit of God is. But if they keep on the outer skirts of the camp all the time, they do not know the impressions that the Lord is making upon His people. We want them to come right in with us, that we may [have] a unity in faith and in

If you are a standard bearer, have you ever been directly, or indirectly, accused by the pastor of being the reason why new members leave so quickly? Although some standard bearers can come across as drowning a new member with all the light they themselves gained along the many years of study and learning, it is typically a rare reason why new people leave so quickly.

The main reason for their departure is actually from having been taught minimal expectations from the Bible and then coming into the church where many members do not even live up to that level anymore. Then the new members see the infighting that goes on by people with liberal agendas who are upset by the resistance from the standard bearers, usually at the very first church board meeting. The new members quickly sense that though the church may have the truth, the exampling of it is very lacking.

You may have heard me share this story once but it is worth repeating. When I was a new member, a family invited us to a Sunday afternoon gathering that including a hay ride pulled by a tractor. While seated next to a twenty-year-old, soon to be twenty-one, I overheard her bragging to her friends that she could not wait for her birthday so she could go legally drinking. I was shocked and asked, "Aren't you a Seventh-day Adventist? And don't Seventh-day Adventists refrain from alcohol?" She said, "Yes, I was born into the church and was baptized a few years ago. And, yes, most frown on the use of alcohol, but so what!" If it were not for another "born-into-the-church" person who was also a standard bearer who befriended me at the time, I would have considered leaving.

And then there is the aforementioned cause for new members leaving so quickly – the new members these days are taught much less than they were taught just a decade or two ago. The pastor tries to turn the church service into an evangelistic tool instead of for what it is to be used - "For the perfecting of the saints, for the work of the ministry, for the edifying of the body of Christ" (Ephesians 4:12). Church is not the place where people are to learn the basics, or even be entertained. That is what Bible study is for. In fact, a potential new member ought to be grounded in many of the beliefs that we hold before stepping into the church and learning that there are many unconverted members, some even still eating swine's flesh is more common than one would think, along with alcohol, tobacco, etc. It could be quite embarrassing to want to discuss sports and television shows with fellow church members only to find out that such is not to be typical Sabbath conversation.

So, the point of this little message is to encourage each one of us to continue to "lift up a standard for the people" (Isaiah 62:10), but be "harmless as doves" (Matthew 10:16). Remember, "the servant of the Lord must not strive; but be gentle unto all [men], apt to teach, patient" (2 Timothy 2:24). And do not let the pastor blame you for the lack of executing their responsibility properly as well as feeding the new members to unconverted members to be devoured.

May God bless you and your efforts in creating members for the heavenly church as opposed to a mere pew warmer.

Now, here is the Word: "That they may believe that thou hast sent me; and the glory which thou gavest me I have given them." That is what we are waiting for here. We want some of that glory, and it is our privilege to have it. There is darkness enough in the world, and we want the light of the glory of God to lighten our pathway and to lighten the pathway of others. We want some of that glory, that you may go forth to your labors with that glory shining upon your countenances, expressed in your words and in your testimonies, that it will make an impression on minds wherever you go.

"And the glory which thou gavest me I have given them, that they may be one, even as we are one." Who is it that is burdened that they may get into unity? Who are they? Where are they? God help us that we may understand what spirit actuates and moves us. "I in them, and thou in me, that they may be made perfect in one." Now their profit is not in seeing just how far they can keep off, and keep another mind and their own ideas, and cherish their own ideas, and water their own ideas. No, but it is that they may be made perfect in one, and they want to be made in one, and they are trying to be one, and they are trying to get where they may be in unity.

"That the world may know that thou hast sent me." Those are the credentials they bear to the world. "And hast loved"—now, mark this; O, it is such a power with me. It has such a power for my heart; it melts and dissolves my very being as I read this. "And hast loved them as thou hast loved me." Why, brethren, can we comprehend this? Can we take hold of it? Can we measure it? "Hast loved them as thou hast loved me." Why, that ought to bring every soul of us in gladness and joy and thankfulness and gratitude the whole time to God, that the preparation has been made that this shall be done, that God loves us as His Son. Why? Because we are united in Christ as He is united with the Father. There is a oneness with those that are partakers of the Spirit of Christ. You may bring the horse to the water, but you never can make him drink, he has got to drink of himself. Just so it is with us; we may have a house around us, and the words of life may be presented in all their beauty and in all their clearness, and it is like the bright shining of the candle. But unless they will kindle their tapers from it, unless they are willing to get some light, they won't have any, no, indeed. Now, that is the most precious to me.

And He says, "Father I will that they also that thou lovest, whom thou hast given me, be with me where I am." Why, in His kingdom they will be right around Him, right about Him. Oh, what a thought! It makes me willing—even if I die at my post—it makes me willing to make an entire sacrifice for the truth's sake. Oh, if I can be with Him where He is! He is my love, my crown of rejoicing. He is my hope and comfort.

Now what? "That they may behold my glory." We have felt Him in the humiliation, we have felt Him in the sacrifice, we have felt Him in the trials, we have felt Him in the test. Now that we may behold Him, that we may see Him as He is, that we may behold His glory. If we behold Him we will be a partaker with Him of His glory. "And the glory which thou gavest me, I have given them. For thou lovest me before the foundations of the world. O, righteous Father, the world hath not known thee." Oh, how little we know thee. And we profess to be His followers. He says, "The world hath not known thee." God forbid that it should be of those that carry the truth to those that are in darkness that Christ will say they do not know it. How few know my Saviour!

"But I have known thee, and these have known that thou hast sent me. And I have declared unto them thy name, and will declare it; that the love wherewith thou hast loved me may be in them, and I in them." That is His Word. We have been reading it for more than the last year more distinctly. "I have declared unto them thy name, "thy name, its goodness, its mercy, its love, its compassion, that you may gather up your forces and think, and that you may plant yourselves upon the Rock Christ Jesus and believe Him.

"I have declared unto them thy name, and will declare it." That is what He came here for. "That the love wherewith thou hast loved me may be in them, and I in them." I am so glad, brethren, I am so glad that we have the privilege. But our minds have become separated from God; and the enemy meant it should be so. He cast his hellish shadow right between us and our hope, and our strength, and our comfort, that we should not see Him; that he might eclipse Jesus, that we should discern Him and what He was to us and what He would do for us, and what He would be to us—that he should cast this dark and gloomy shadow between us and our Saviour.

Now, we have been just getting a glimmering of faith. We have not but a little of it. Yet it is so very hard for

the mind that has been looking on the dark shadow, and that has been hanging memory's hall all through with disconsolate things and pictures that are draped in mourning, that it seems as though that we cannot look upon anything else. But may God help to gather up the jewels of Christ. God help us that we may hang memory's hall all through with the rich promises of God, that when Satan shall come to cast his hellish shadow between us and the source of our strength that we may just be armed. We have got the memorials all surrounding us-barricaded with the promises—and we can say, "Although the fig tree shall not blossom, neither fruit be found in the vine; the labor of the olive shall fail, and the fields shall yield no meat; the flock shall be cut off from the fold, and there shall be no herd in the stall: yet I will rejoice in the Lord, I will joy in the God of my salvation."

And when sometimes it seems that the Word is made so hard because unbelief is planted in the hearts where faith ought to be flourishing, I repeat that text over and over again, and I bring myself in position where I can perceive the light and the brightness of the Sun of Righteousness. I will not look at the darkness. Brethren and sisters, I beg of you for Christ's sake, to lift Him up – the Man of Calvary. Lift Him up, the sinner's only hope. Learn of Him, every one of you.

Oh, may chapters be opened in your experience that you never have opened before in regard to the blessedness and the trust and confidence that you may have in God. Just see what our Saviour says: "When the Son of man cometh shall he find faith in the earth?" Why? Why, because the devil has put his dark mantle to enshroud the people when we want light, light, brethren, light, precious light from the throne of God. Well, then, you want to be sure that you learn how to tell it when you go from here. You want to be so rooted and grounded in it that when you go to those that are fastened in unbelief that they shall not throw their darkness over your mind, that you shall become so settled as to what is truth that you will not be shaken away from it, but that God can reveal to you His precious, precious light.

Now, Paul knew that he was not going to stay very long with Timothy, and he kept giving him lessons all the time, and he says, "My son, be strong in the grace that is in Christ Jesus." That is what every one of us want not any of your own opinions, nor smartness, nor intellect, nor any of these things—but be strong in the grace that is in Christ Jesus. "And the things that thou hast heard of me among many witnesses, the same commit thou to faithful men, who shall be able to teach also. Thou therefore endure hardness, as a good soldier of Jesus Christ." There is the very word before us.

And the very men that ought to be here to feel their interest of having the truth for their positions of trust here in Battle Creek, on this missionary soil, the very men that ought to be fitting for these positions, they are not here at all, they do not come near. Now, Brethren, that is not as it ought to be. I want you to meditate over these matters. I want you to seek God in regard to it. I want you to tell the Lord to stir up these souls, that they may begin to feel that they need something more than they [have] got.

Brethren, we want light, precious light from the throne of God. And in place of quibbling, and in the place of fastening up hooks that you can hang your doubts upon, for Christ's sake, go to your knees in prayer. For Christ's sake, see the errors and mistake of the Jews, because Christ has said, "Light has come, and ye choose darkness rather than light." Now this can be done right where light is shining. You meet men who say, Beware, beware; we must go carefully; we must be very careful to press out the darkness and let the light come in.

Brethren, we want to come right up, as a man, and obtain a living experience here in this meeting. You want light enough that you can carry it with you into eternity. This is what you want. We have not half faith enough. We are only just beginning to learn as little children. The child first takes a step and falls, and then takes another step, and finally learns how to walk. Now, we want to learn how to exercise faith.

When the centurion came to Christ, just look at his faith. Why, he did not claim all the knowledge of the Jews. But here this centurion came, and he says, O Lord, you need not go away down there to heal my servant, you just say it and it will be done. What kind of power did he think was in Christ? Just what was invested in him. Now, said he, you may just say the word. I say to my servant, go, and he goeth; and I say to him, do this, and he doeth it. Well now, all you have to say is to command, and it will be done. What was his insight? That there were angels all around Christ; the word of Christ would go right to that sick chamber and heal that servant. The Jews saw how Christ said to him, "I have not found so great faith, no not in all Israel."

Now there are those outside of us that are standing in greater favor to God than we are, and why? Because they live up to every jot of light that they have. And we have light pouring in on us, and for months we have been pleading that the people would come up and accept the light, and they do not know whether to do it or not. They do not seem to see that they can come and drink, that they can open their hearts and let the Saviour in. My soul is agonized, at times, over these things. But I cannot do anything, I cannot speak to the heart—but God alone can speak to the heart.

I entreat of you, as an ambassador of Jesus Christ, to bruise Satan under your feet. I beseech of you to labor for yourself, labor for souls that are in darkness and unbelief. I beseech of you to spend your efforts in order to bring them where they can come where the living waters flow—where the light of Heaven may come upon them, that they can stand amid the people as a light, and not as a shadow of darkness.

Well, yesterday morning I awoke about two o'clock, and I could not rest. It seemed as though there was an agony of soul upon me, and I could not say anything. I knelt right down before the Lord, and I said, You know all about it; You know what the burden is. And I must have something more than this. I cannot carry this load. I feel such a responsibility when I know that men are not walking in the light, when I know that they are going contrary from what God has told me. And it seemed as though there was a lightwave came right down upon me, and the peace of God came upon me; and the words, I will

be with you, I will give thee My strength, came to me.

And since yesterday morning I have felt that I could die for Jesus Christ. And I am not going to leave it right in the hands of God. Brethren, do we carry our loads there and leave them? Let us do it. Let us roll it right on the Burden-bearer, and when we have a part to act, we will act it. And when you go from this place, Oh be so full of the message that it is like fire shut up in your bones, that you cannot hold your peace.

It is true men will say you are too excited; you are making too much of this matter, and you do not think enough of the law. [They say], "Now you must think more of the law. Don't be all the time reaching for this righteousness of Christ, but build up the law." Let the law take care of itself. We have been at work on the law until we got as dry as the hills of Gilboa without dew or rain. Let us trust in the merits of Jesus Christ of Nazareth.

May God help us that our eyes may be anointed with eyesalve, that we may see. God helping us we will draw nigh to Him, and He says He will draw nigh to us. Do we believe? Will we come in God's appointed way? May the Lord help us and enlighten us, that we may go forth from this place as they went forth to proclaim the truth after the day of Pentecost, and there were souls converted, they could not resist the testimony.

"WHEREFORE, I will not be negligent to put you always in remembrance of these things, though ye know them, and be established in the PRESENT TRUTH." 2Pet.i:12.

It is through the truth that souls are sanctified, and made ready to enter the everlasting kingdom. Obedience to the truth will kill us to this world, that we may be made alive, by faith in Jesus. "Sanctify them through thy truth; thy word is truth;" John xvii:17. This was the prayer of Jesus. "I have no greater joy than to hear that my children walk in truth," 3John iv.

Error, darkens and fetters the mind, but the truth brings with it freedom, and gives light and life. True charity, or LOVE, "rejoiceth in the truth;" Cor.xiii:6. "Thy law is the truth." Ps.cxix:142.

David describing the day of slaughter, when the pestilence shall walk in darkness, and destruction waste at noon-day, so that, "a thousand shall fall at thy side and ten thousand at thy right hand," says -

"He shall cover thee with his feathers, and under his wings shalt thou trust; his TRUTH shall be thy SHIELD and BUCKLER." Ps.xci:4.

The storm is coming. War, famine and pestilence are already in the field of slaughter. Now is the time, the only time to seek a shelter in the truth of the living God.

In Peter's time there was present truth, or truth applicable to that present time. The Church have ever had a present truth. The present truth now, is that which shows present duty, and the right position for us who are about to witness the time of trouble, such as never was. I tremble at the word of the Lord, and the importance of this time. What is done to spread the truth must be done quickly. The four Angels are holding the angry nations in check but a few days, until the saints are sealed; then the nations will rush, like the rushing of many waters. Then it will be too late to spread before precious souls, the present saving, living truths of the Holy Bible. My spirit is drawn out after the scattered remnant. May God help them to receive the truth, and be established in it. May they haste to take shelter beneath the "covering of the Almighty God," is my prayer.

The Weekly Sabbath Instituted at Creation, and not at Sinai

"And on the seventh day GOD ended his work which he had made; and he rested on the seventh day from all his work which he had made. And God blessed the seventh day, and sanctified it: because that in it he had rested from all his work which GOD created and made." Gen.ii:2,3.

Here God instituted the weekly rest or Sabbath. It was the seventh day. He BLESSED and SANCTIFIED that day of the week, and no other; therefore the seventh day, and no other day of the week is holy, sanctified time.

GOD has given the reason why he blessed and sanctified the seventh day. "Because that in it he had rested from all his work which GOD had created and made." He rested, and set the example for man. He blessed and set apart the seventh day for man to rest from his labor, and follow the example of his Creator. The Lord of the Sabbath said, Mark ii:27, "The Sabbath was made for man." Not for the Jew only, but for MAN, in its broadest sense; meaning all mankind. The word man in this text, means the same as it does in the following texts. "Man that is born of woman is of few days and full of trouble." Job xiv:1. "Man lieth down and riseth not, till the heavens be no more." Job xiv:12.

No one will say that man here means Jews, or Christians; but the whole human race. The Sabbath was made for man, for the whole race of man. Adam, Noah, and Abraham were men, therefore the Sabbath was made for them, as well as for Moses, and the Jews. We are men, and the Sabbath is made for us.

GOD has given the following reason in the decalogue, why man should keep his holy Sabbath - "FOR in six days the Lord made heaven and earth, the sea and all that in them is, and rested the seventh day: wherefore the Lord BLESSED the seventh day and HALLOWED it." Ex.xx:11.

Here our minds are directed back more than twenty-five hundred years, to the creation and holy rest in Eden, for the origin of the Sabbath. This plain fact every candid mind must see. GOD did not bless and hallow the Sabbath day at Sinai - no, no. This he had done in Eden twentyfive hundred years before.

"And GOD blessed the seventh day, and sanctified it:" Gen.ii:3.

The Sabbath was marked and guarded with miracles by Jehovah and kept by Israel in the wilderness of Sin, thirty days before they came to Sinai.

"And it came to pass, that on the sixth day they gathered twice as much bread, two omers for one man: to-morrow is the rest of the Holy Sabbath unto the Lord: bake that which ye will bake to-day, and seethe that ye will seethe; and that which remaineth over, lay up for you to be kept until the morning."

"And Moses said, eat that to-day, for to-day is a Sabbath unto the Lord: today ye shall not find in the field. Six days ye shall gather it; but on the seventh day, which is the Sabbath, in it there shall be none."

"And it came to pass, that there went out some of the people on the seventh day for to gather, and they found none. And the Lord said unto Moses, How long refuse ye to keep my commandments and my laws? See, for that the Lord hath given you the Sabbath. So the people rested on the seventh day." See Ex.xvi:22-30.


The children of Israel departed from Egypt on the fifteenth day of the first month, and came to the wilderness of Sin on the fifteenth day of the second month. Here GOD gives them bread from heaven, and reminds them of the Sabbath. From the wilderness of Sin they journeyed to Rephidim, and from Rephidim they came to the desert of Sinai, on the fifteenth day of the third month.

Mark this. GOD gives them manna, reminds them of his Sabbath, and guards it with miracles thirty days before they saw Mount Sinai, and thirty-two days before GOD spake from the smoking mount, the ten commandments.

We frequently hear the assertion, that the Sabbath is not mentioned in the Bible, till after the law was given from Mount Sinai; therefore, the seventh day Sabbath is the Sabbath of the old Jews, and is abolished. Not long since a second advent preacher made this false statement to me. Another person repeated this statement to me not two weeks since. Now, I hope all who are laboring under this mistaken view will look again. Please read the history of the journey of Israel from Egypt to Mount Sinai, found in Exodus.

The Lord said to Moses, thirty-two days before he gave the law of commandments, "How long refuse ye to keep MY COMMANDMENTS and MY LAWS? See, for that the Lord hath given you the Sabbath." The Sabbath is not mentioned here as a new institution, but an old one, that they had not kept while in bondage to the Egyptians. GOD brought Israel out of the house of bondage to prove them, and see if they would keep his commandments. They had been from Egypt but thirty days when GOD reminded them of his Sabbath.

"And thou shalt remember all the way which the Lord thy GOD led thee these forty years in the wilderness, to humble thee, and to prove thee, to know what was in thy heart, whether thou wouldst keep his



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commandments, or no." Deut.viii:2. They could not keep his Sabbath in Egypt. They could not keep it; neither can we keep it when bound by sectarian creeds. Therefore GOD has brought us out of the churches to prove us, to try us, to know what is in our hearts, whether we will keep his commandments.

The Sabbath a perpetual Weekly Memorial

"Verily my Sabbaths ye shall keep; for it is a sign between me and you throughout your generations; that ye may know that I am the Lord that doth SANCTIFY you." "Wherefore the children of Israel shall keep the Sabbath, to observe the Sabbath throughout their generations, for a PERPETUAL covenant."

"It is a sign between me and the children of Israel FOREVER: FOR in six days the Lord made heaven and earth, and on the seventh day he rested and was refreshed." Ex.xxxi:13 -17.

The Sabbath then is a sign, or seal between GOD and his people forever. It is a perpetual covenant between them. Will some one show us the end of a perpetual covenant, given for a sign forever? The only reason here given why the Sabbath is a perpetual sign, is, "for in six days the Lord made heaven and earth, and on the seventh he rested." This shows that the Sabbath was given for a weekly memorial. The passover was given for a memorial to Israel to remind them of their deliverance from bondage, and that they should not forget GOD, who passed over their houses in slaying their first-born, and with strength of hand brought them out of Egypt.

The communion of the body and blood of Christ was given for a memorial to the Church, that we may not forget the sufferings and death of the Lamb of GOD.

So the Sabbath was given to man for a weekly memorial, that on the seventh day he might dismiss all servile labor and care, and look back to the creation and holy rest, and thus call to mind, worship and adore the great Jehovah. If man had kept the weekly rest, he would never have forgotten GOD, who made heaven and earth. "The wicked shall be turned into hell, and all the nations that forget GOD." Ps.ix:17.

This view gives the Sabbath its just weight of importance. How wise and wonderful the plan of Jehovah, laid out in the beginning. Man was to labour six days, and on the seventh day rest from servile labour and care. He was to look to the heavens, the earth, the sea, and all things, even himself - the noblest of creation, and thus call to mind the Living God.

Battle With Self

One of the greatest battlefields to face is not the antichrist or even Satan, but it is with self. "We should teach our children to practice habits of self-denial, that the great battle of life is with self, to restrain the passions, and bring them into subjection to the mental and moral faculties" {An Appeal to Mothers, page 19.1}.

What did Jesus say is necessary in order to have Him in our lives? "Then said Jesus unto his disciples, If any [man] will come after me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross, and follow me" (Matthew 16:24). Jesus said that we had to deny ourselves. We have to train our mind to not get everything it wants or craves. That is called "developing discipline". The more we exercise self -control the more disciplined we become. The more we give in to our wants and cravings the less disciplined we become. Discipline is developed, and is not something we are born with. "We must institute a warfare against every sinful inclination, and submit to the control of the Spirit of God. Every time we yield to temptation it becomes easier to yield the next time" {RH, March 12, 1889 par. 2}. "On the other hand, every resistance of temptation makes resistance more easy. Every denial of self makes self-denial easier. Every victory gained prepares the way for a fresh victory. Each resistance of temptation, each self-denial, each triumph over sin, is a seed sown unto eternal life. Every unselfish action gives new strength to spirituality. No one can try to be like Christ without growing more noble and more true" {LHU 299.4}.

ourselves? "I protest by your rejoicing which I have in Christ Jesus our Lord, I die daily" (1 Corinthians 15:31). Unlike the "once saved, always saved" crowd, the Bible tells us that it is a daily denial of self, in fact, it can be said that every moment of the day requires denial of self.

How will denial of self affect the body? "But I keep under my body, and bring [it] into subjection: lest that by any means, when I have preached to others, I myself should be a castaway" (1 Corinthians 9:27). We need to bring our bodies into subjection. We need to not allow every craving to gain the ascendency no matter what bodily sense it is trying to come in through.

What must we believe we have to gain the victory? "According as his divine power hath given unto us all things that [pertain] unto life and godliness, through the knowledge of him that hath called us to glory and virtue: Whereby are given unto us exceeding great and precious promises: that by these ye might be partakers of the divine nature, having escaped the corruption that is in the world through lust" (2 Peter 1:3-4). We must believe that Heaven sent divine power is granted to us, "for when I am weak, then am I strong" (2 Corinthians 12:10), and then we no longer live in the carnal or human nature but the "divine nature".

Why do we struggle so easily with temptation then? "For we know that the law is spiritual: but I am carnal, sold under sin" (Romans 7:14). We wrestle with our carnal natures. It gets the ascendency, or we consult with it. "How can I allow a little

selfishness and yet be on safe ground?" Or something to that effect is often dwelt upon instead of a sharp resistance.

Where do we NOT find anything good? "For I know that in me (that is, in my flesh,) dwelleth no good thing: for to will is present with me; but [how] to perform that which is good I find not" (Romans 7:18). Definitely not inside ourselves, therefore, we must depend wholly upon God for the victory.

Then what do we need dwelling in us? "So then they that are in the flesh cannot please God. But ye are not in the flesh, but in the Spirit, if so be that the Spirit of God dwell in you. Now if any man have not the Spirit of Christ, he is none of his" (Romans 8:8 -9). We need the Spirit dwelling in us. No wnder the Spirit "will reprove the world of sin, and of righteousness, and of judgment" (John 16:8).

What is promised if the Spirit dwells in us? "That the righteousness of the law might be fulfilled in us, who walk not after the flesh, but after the Spirit" (Romans 8:4). The righteousness of the law would be fulfilled in us then. In other words, we will then be actually keeping the commandments of God.

What warning are we given regarding the flesh? "For he that soweth to his flesh shall of the flesh reap corruption; but he that soweth to the Spirit shall of the Spirit reap life everlasting" (Galatians 6:8). We ought not sow to the flesh, but notice that it is a choice, just like Joshua stated, "Choose you this day whom ye will serve" (Joshua 24:15). This goes back to the beginning in which Jesus tells us to deny ourselves.

What is the strength level of our flesh? "Watch and pray, that ye enter not into temptation: the spirit indeed [is] willing, but the flesh [is] weak" (Matthew 26:41). The flesh is weak. That means, every time we fall it means that we are listening to the flesh instead of the Spirit. We need to build up a resistance to the flesh, the cravings, the desires. We fall because "Ye have not yet resisted unto blood, striving against sin" (Hebrews 12:4).

Where is the battleground actually fought? "Because the carnal mind [is] enmity against God: for it is not subject to the law of God, neither indeed can be" (Romans 8:7). It is the mind. That is because "as he thinketh in his heart, so [is] he" (Proverbs 23:7). Thoughts become actions.

What do we specifically fight against? "Casting down imaginations, and every high thing that exalteth itself against the knowledge of God, and bringing into captivity every thought to the obedience of Christ" (2 Corinthians 10:5). It is imaginations. We imagine we are going to suffer if we do not give in. "I will be so hungry if I don't continue eating beyond my comfortableness." In reality, we are just stretching the stomach when we should be thinking of how we can shrink the stomach, like on the two meals a day plan as opposed to grazing all day.

How do we know we are actually battling in the war as opposed to simply fooling ourselves as we are defeated over and over? "For they that are after the flesh do mind the things of the flesh; but they that are after the Spirit the things of the Spirit" (Romans 8:5). When a person is overcome, how they feel afterwards determines if the defeat was due to weakness in the battle or secret enjoyment of having given in. In other words, are we remorseful for giving in or not. Many Christians see sin as no big deal. That is foolishness.

What are we called to do? "Having therefore these promises, dearly beloved, let us cleanse ourselves from all filthiness of the flesh and spirit, perfecting holiness in the fear of God" (2 Corinthians 7:1). A cleansing process of all filthiness must be performed. Too many simply pick certain fruit to throw away while still left with other bad fruit that undermines the determination. In other words, they will work on cutting out smoking, drinking, and watching fouled language movies, but tell themselves that once they get those things under control, then they can work on temper, diet, and the raunchy music. It has to be a total house cleanse because what is not cleaned out weakens the person when confrontation towards the primary temptations come on. We should not be looking at the bad fruit to pick but "the axe is laid unto the root of the trees" (Luke 3:9). The root of selfishness needs to be cut down.

What is the battle like? "[This] I say then, Walk in the Spirit, and ye shall not fulfil the lust of the flesh. For the flesh lusteth against the Spirit, and the Spirit against the flesh: and these are contrary the one to the other: so that ye cannot do the things that ye would. But if ye be led of the Spirit, ye are not under the law. Now the works of the flesh are manifest, which are [these]; Adultery, fornication, uncleanness, lasciviousness, Idolatry, witchcraft, hatred, variance, emulations, wrath, strife, seditions, heresies, Envyings, murders, drunkenness, revellings, and such like: of the which I tell you before, as I have also told [you] in time past, that they which do such things shall not inherit the kingdom of God. But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, gentleness, goodness, faith, Meekness, temperance: against such there is no law. And they that are Christ's have crucified the flesh with the affections and lusts. If we live in the Spirit, let us also walk in the Spirit" (Galatians 5:16-25). We have to recognize that our struggles are in the category of lusting, which is not reserved for sexuality alone. That makes a real wrestling match.

What needs to be developed? "And others save with fear, pulling [them] out of the fire; hating even the garment spotted by the flesh" (Jude 1:23). Hating to see our garments spotted with sin needs to be encouraged. Ask God to give the proper hatred.

What must we be careful not to listen to? "For many deceivers are entered into the world, who confess not that Jesus Christ is come in the flesh. This is a deceiver and an antichrist" (2 John 1:7). Do not listen to anyone that teaches Jesus was different from us, as if He had the nature of Adam before the fall. That is what the average Christian is taught, which is deadly error. If that were the case, then this whole message is worthless. There is not even a reason to be battling self for there would be no way for us to ever gain the victory. The truth of the matter is, "For verily he took not on [him the nature of] angels; but he took on [him] the seed

of Abraham" (Hebrews 2:16). Jesus took on our nature and defeated Satan in our flesh, our nature.

What may we have to change to get the upper hand? "Among whom also we all had our conversation in times past in the lusts of our flesh, fulfilling the desires of the flesh and of the mind; and were by nature the children of wrath, even as others" (Ephesians 2:3). Stop talking about how great the difficulty is against certain sins. The more a person talks about certain temptations being too strong to resist, that person will never gain the victory. We must talk "with God all things are possible" (Matthew 19:26). It is highly encouraged that we read Steps to *Christ* by Ellen White frequently until victory is gained. "Many who are really conscientious, and who desire to live for God, he too often leads to dwell upon their own faults and weaknesses, and thus by separating them from Christ he hopes to gain the victory. We should not make self the center and indulge anxiety and

fear as to whether we shall be saved. All this turns the soul away from the Source of our strength. Commit the keeping of your soul to God, and trust in Him. Talk and think of Jesus. Let self be lost in Him. Put away all doubt; dismiss your fears" {SC 71.2}.

Who helps us to bring the will into conformity? "Forasmuch then as Christ hath suffered for us in the flesh, arm yourselves likewise with the same mind: for he that hath suffered in the flesh hath ceased from sin" (1 Peter 4:1). Go to Jesus for He alone will help us bring our wills in line "For it is God which worketh in you both to will and to do of [his] good pleasure" (Philippians 2:13).

What practically are we to do? "Submit yourselves therefore to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you" (James 4:7).

May each of us experience victory over self.

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How Do You Resolve It?

It is one thing to know some verses that help a person stay in the faith, but it is another thing to know the Word in such a way that when a verse seems contradictory to know how to resolve it. True Seventh-day Adventists do not ignore verses. It is our hope that this section will help answer some of those challenges that we may come across personally or be used by others against our beliefs.

To Keep the Sabbath or Not

Here is a very specific verse commanding the keeping of the Sabbath day right down to the exact day to be kept, and stated more than once:

Exodus 20:8-11, "Remember the sabbath day, to keep it holy. Six days shalt thou labour, and do all thy work: But the seventh day [is] the sabbath of the LORD thy God: [in it] thou shalt not do any work, thou, nor thy son, nor thy daughter, thy manservant, nor thy maidservant, nor thy cattle, nor thy stranger that [is] within thy gates: For [in] six days the LORD made heaven and earth, the sea, and all that in them [is], and rested the seventh day: wherefore the LORD blessed the sabbath day, and hallowed it."

But here is a pair of verses in the New Testament that appears to make the Sabbath unimportant where people are given the option to keep it or not.

Romans 14:5-6, "One man esteemeth one day above another: another esteemeth every day [alike]. Let every man be fully persuaded in his own mind. He that regardeth the day, regardeth [it] unto the Lord; and he that regardeth not the day, to the Lord he doth not regard [it]. He that eateth, eateth to the Lord, for he giveth God thanks; and he that eateth not, to the Lord he eateth not, and giveth God thanks." First, there is an assumption made that Romans 14 is referring to the Sabbath when, in the whole book of Romans, the word "Sabbath" is never mentioned. It is a very weak argument against the Sabbath to use an assumption as one remembers that feast days were also held in high regards. Some of those days were treated like Sabbath days (Leviticus 23:24, 32, 39). These, like birthdays, would fall on any day of the week over the years.

The fact that Romans 14:1-4 talks about an argument over the dietary restrictions, eating herbs (verse 2), that are very specific in conducting the feast days which is also mentioned in verse 6, makes the conversation not Sabbath-related per the Ten Commandments, but feastrelated where the topic is about the Jews trying to make the Gentiles keep the feast days as well as the specific food associated with each feast. Paul's solution was that if you want to keep the feast day, go ahead; if you want to eat herbs only on the feast days, go ahead; but do not make anyone follow your example as it is not a requirement anymore.

So, there is no contradiction. Exodus 20:8-11 is part of the Ten Commandments, while Romans 14:5-6 is pointing back to the feast days listed in Leviticus 23.

Heavenly Health

What part does the mind play in the health of the body?

First of all, let us attempt to define what the mind is in usable terms. From Webster's 1828 Dictionary comes this abbreviated definition: "The intellectual or intelligent power in man; the understanding; the power that conceives, judges or reasons." We could say it is a collection of all the mental functions of the brain including feelings, or affections, thoughts and ideas, which all join hands to form our intellect. Impulses to perform duties are born in the mind. Cultivation of habits and character, right or wrong, takes place there, and the process is such that the mind itself can actually become set in a certain bent, affecting, and possibly stunting our spiritual growth, and our thinking and behaving in a negative way, so we must be very careful to steer our thoughts in a positive direction, as negativity does not originate with God. The mind needs to be exercised like any other part of the body so we may increase in knowledge and reasoning, therefore, it is imperative to have a healthy, vigorous, clear mind. Since the health of the mind depends much on that of the body, it is equally necessary for adequate care and exercise of the physical faculties in order to have a strong, balanced mind.

Both body and mind require the proper nutrition to function properly, but even when providing the best of food to our minds and bodies, the mind will become just as bogged down as the physical body if the body is overfed and its own systems are clogged. Overindulgence always clouds the mind, making our thought processes and reasoning difficult and confused. We are not to ever be slaves to appetite, instead we are to be masters over it. A clear mind and good overall health can be achieved and maintained when we fuel our bodies with good food, and only as much as is needed – not until we are "full"!

Just like all the mechanical parts of an automobile, all parts of the human body work best when everything is in balance and in a state of good repair, according to the manufacturer's manual, because all parts must work together. So, do we get warning lights as cars do? Sometimes we do, but many times we are not following the directions for care and we miss the signs that are not immediately evident until much further down the road when it is more difficult to turn back and correct our course. We must be cognizant of what we are doing to our bodies at all times so if a mistake has been made, we can correct it quickly and get back on the right track.

Proverbs 17:22 says, "A merry heart doeth good like a medicine." What is meant by "a merry heart" is simply a heart, or spirit, that is cheerful, peaceful, and delights in right-doing. If you have a Bible with marginal readings, the word "medicine" in this verse is defined as "healing". This delightful mind-set can be the result of proper discipline of the thoughts and reactions to events and circumstances, bringing them into line with scripture, and can bring about healing, just as the scripture suggests. I would find it hard to believe that there is a single

physician anywhere, unless he or she is a hard-core atheist, who would not prescribe cheerfulness, and peaceful living to assist in any healing modality. Cheerfulness promotes health and is a friend to both body and mind.

The mind and the body do not operate as separate units; they must work in unison. Happiness and cheerfulness flow through our systems via the mind just as surely as the blood flows through our veins to every organ, lightening their burdens and flushing away any build-up of trash that has been allowed to accumulate, setting us up for disease. What better way to promote harmony in a system than to maintain a clear mind filled with joy. As was stated in our October, 2023 article, "To be in health is to be whole... to be whole is to be complete in every area of our lives mental and spiritual as well as physical", and so now we can see that the mind, the very life, and the body make up the whole man, and when a person is sanctified in a Biblical sense, all of these parts are set apart to the glory of God, and employed in the service of our Creator. That sanctification begins with the mind. Sanctification cleanses our minds from sinful, carnal thoughts; it redirects the current, or

direction, of the thoughts so they flow from sin to holiness. And in this work, we are to be laborers together with God.

Now let us notice the word "holiness" and see how it plays a major role in the health of body and mind. When we read Hebrews 12:14, "Follow peace with all [men], and holiness, without which no man shall see the Lord:", it is helpful to know that the root-word of "health" is actually the same root-word of "holiness"; so, holiness of the body and mind is expressed in the word "health". We cannot expect to enter heaven with unhealthy, unholy carnal minds and bodies, so this ties in with the work of sanctification mentioned in the previous paragraph and is very important to our understanding of God's requirements of us in the care of our entire beings.

2 Corinthians 7:1 says, "...dearly beloved, let us cleanse ourselves from all filthiness of the flesh and spirit, perfecting holiness in the fear of God." Here we see the definite connection of body and mind, reinforcing the importance of performing this sanctifying action since it is to be done "in the fear of God". It seems an old saying we have probably all heard is taking on a deeper meaning now and we will not be taking it so lightly the next time

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we hear it – "Cleanliness is next to Godliness". There is much more to it than meets the eye.

We could go much further into this study, but I believe we have

sufficiently answered our title question for now, but as with all of these health articles, we will refer back to it in future studies.

Oven Baked Tofu

(this is a gluten free version)

Ingredients

- 1 pound super-firm tofu
- 1 ½ c. vegetable broth
- 1 tablespoon liquid coconut aminos
- 1/2 cup vegan mayonnaise,
- 1/4 cup chickpea flour
- 1/4 cup brown rice flour*
- 1 teaspoon onion powder
- 1/2 teaspoon garlic powder
- 1 teaspoon Italian seasoning
- 1/2 teaspoon smoked paprika
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1-2 tablespoons olive oil

press tofu between paper towels to remove excess water.

- Then cut into strips or cubes and marinate in vegetable broth for 30 minutes.
- 3. Mix vegan mayonnaise with the coconut aminos and coat the tofu with it.
- 4. In another bowl combine the remaining ingredients well.
- Coat tofu with dry herb mix and place on a greased baking sheet that has been oiled with olive oil (to keep the tofu from sticking)

Questions And Answers

Allow at least three (3) months before your question may appear.

QUESTION: Why should spiritual formation be avoided?

ANSWER: This is not an all-inclusive answer but definitely enough to raise objections to the philosophy.

The fact that this is not a unique teaching among Seventh-day Adventists but is found as a teaching among all the denominations is concerning enough.

But several strong objections to spiritual formation include finding

the source of strength from within, the encouragement to empty the mind, and a gateway to Eastern mysticism. It encourages selfcenteredness but of course it is sold with a nice, desirable coating that makes it appealing. The fact that it is sweeping Christianity should send up a red flag.

"I saw that God has honest children among the nominal Adventists and the fallen churches, and before the plagues shall be poured out, ministers and people will be called out from these churches and will gladly receive the truth. Satan knows this; and before the loud cry of the third angel is given, he raises an excitement in these religious bodies, that those who have rejected the truth may think that God is with them. He hopes to deceive the honest and lead them to think that God is still working for the churches. But the light will shine, and all who are honest will leave the fallen churches, and take their stand with the remnant" {EW 261.1}.

According to the definition from their own website, it includes "Specific techniques of prayer and meditation". If we need to use certain sets of techniques to pray, that should frighten us. Jesus simply said, "After this manner therefore pray ye: Our Father which art in heaven ... " (Matthew 6:9). When meditation involves emptying the mind, Jesus told the parable, "When the unclean spirit is gone out of a man, he walketh through dry places, seeking rest; and finding none, he saith, I will return unto my house whence I came out. And when he cometh, he findeth [it] swept and garnished. Then goeth he, and taketh [to him] seven other spirits more

wicked than himself; and they enter in, and dwell there: and the last [state] of that man is worse than the first" (Luke 11:24-26). This shows that there is danger with leaving the mind empty. It needs to be filled with the Word of God, the Holy Spirit. Another technique used in spiritual formation is that of visualization. This can be taken to the level of allowing a spirit to separate from the body, which is satanic, but on the low key, to visualize the unknown is stepping into territory that the Bible does not support and God never told us to practice.

The second definition includes "A lifestyle integrating spiritual disciplines or exercises". Yoga and other practices of human traditions are the opposite of what Jesus taught. "Making the word of God of none effect through your tradition, which ye have delivered: and many such like things do ye" (Mark 7:13). Chanting is another practice, but Jesus said, "But when ye pray, use not vain repetitions, as the heathen [do]: for they think that they shall be heard for their much speaking" (Matthew 6:7).

The third definition includes "Understanding and practice of

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historical religious philosophy and techniques". All of this smacks of human philosophy and human teachings. Besides, God called truth seekers out of all the historical movements into the one body containing the truth. This movement of calling people out of Babylon and into spiritual Israel began in 1844 and will continue to the end of time. "And he said unto me, Thou must prophesy again before many peoples, and nations, and tongues, and kings" (Revelation 10:11). "And I saw another angel fly in the midst of heaven, having the everlasting gospel to preach unto them that dwell on the earth, and to every nation, and kindred, and tongue, and people" (Revelation 14:6). "And I heard another voice from heaven, saying, Come out of her, my people, that ye be not partakers of her sins, and that ye receive not of her plagues" (Revelation 18:4).

The fourth definition includes "The knowledge and expression of the

truth of God and of self". Self has no truth. Further, truth is not found in all religions making up a collective truth. There is only one location. "Jesus saith unto him, I am the way, the truth, and the life: no man cometh unto the Father, but by me" (John 14:6). It is the Christian religion alone that has the truth. Further, all denominations may have some aspect of truth, but spiritual formation does not recognize that one denomination has all of the truth. vet true Seventh-dav Adventists are to believe that we are the only ones with the truth and have the only saving message to proclaim.


