Yet they seek me daily, and delight to know my ways, as a nation that did righteousness, and forsook not the ordinance of their God; they ask of me the ordinances of justice; they take delight in approaching to God. Wherefore have we fasted, say they, and thou seest not? Wherefore have we afflicted our soul, and thou takest no knowledge? Behold, in the day of your fast ye find pleasure, and exact all your labors. Behold, ye fast for strife and debate, and to smite with the fist of wickedness; ye shall not fast as ye do this day, to make your voice to be heard on high. Is it such a fast that I have chosen? A day for a man to afflict his soul? is it to bow down his head as a bulrush, and to

spread sackcloth and ashes under him? Wilt thou call this a fast, and an acceptable day to the Lord? Is not this the fast that I have chosen? to loose the bands of wickedness, to undo the heavy burdens, and to let the oppressed go free, and that ye break every yoke? Is it not to deal thy bread to the hungry, and that thou bring the poor that are cast out to thy house? when thou seest the naked, that thou cover him; and that thou hide not thyself from thine own flesh?"

the light? By getting out from ourselves and seeing what good we can do for others that are around us. We may feel that it is too great a task upon us, but in doing good to others it reacts back upon us, and if we comfort others with the comfort wherewith we are comforted, the blessing will come back to us. And how? "Ye are laborers together with God."

You see, we are drawing in the same line with Jehovah, and all of the heavenly intelligences are interested in the work going on here in this earth. If there had not been that interest, none of us could be saved. And notwithstanding man transgressed God's holy law, Jesus Christ steps forward and says, I will die that they may have life; I will take the penalty of the law upon Myself, and give man another trial. Now, while this is granted, it is our time to work. Not merely the ministers, but every soul who claims to know God and Jesus Christ are under obligation to God. How? Why, He has bought us by the infinite price of His own blood, therefore we are to be engaged in laboring for fallen humanity.

heavenly attraction. We want to see the glory and attraction there is for those who seek for glory and heavenly honor and immortal life—a life that measures with the life of God. And what more? Are there any here who know what it is to lose earthly possessions? But the possessions granted by God "fadeth not away, reserved in heaven for you."

Jacob in his dream saw the ladder, the base of which rested upon the earth and the topmost round reaching into the highest heaven while the angels of God were ascending and descending upon this mystic Ladder, and when he awoke he said, surely the Lord is in this place, and I knew it not." Thus it is with us. If our eyes could be opened, we would see the angels of God all around us, and the evil angels are here also trying to destroy us, but the good angels are pressing them back.

Then he climbs right away from the customs, practices, and fashions of earth right towards heaven, and the light and glory of God is upon every round of this mystic ladder, and man climbs upon who? - Jesus Christ. Clings to what? -Jesus Christ. Made one with whom? -Jesus Christ. There he is holding to the ladder, climbing the ladder round by round, and it is his work to get every one to come.

Now we find that the battlements can be reached and that God is above the ladder and is waiting with arms outstretched to help every soul that will come into the everlasting kingdom of our God. Praise His holy name! Ye inhabitants of the earth, praise Him! And why? Because through Jesus Christ, whose long human arm encircles the race while with His divine arm He grasps the throne of the Almighty, the gulf is bridged with His own body; and this atom of a world which was separated from the continent of heaven by sin and became an island, is again reinstated, because Christ bridged the gulf—Christ has bridged it!

"Then shalt thou call, and the Lord shall answer." He will answer, What will you have? What shall I do for you? "thou shalt cry, and he shall say, Here I am. If thou take away from the midst of thee the yoke, the putting forth of the finger, and speaking vanity; And if thou draw out thy soul to the hungry, and satisfy the afflicted soul; then shall thy light rise in obscurity, and thy darkness be as the noonday." That is just what we want – we want light as the noonday. We want the cloud that comes from

the world rolled back, and we want the revealings of God to us. "And the Lord shall guide thee continually, and satisfy thy soul in drought, and make fat thy bones; and thou shalt be like a watered garden, and like a spring of water, whose waters fail not."

The repairer of the breach, The restorer of paths to dwell in. What is that? It is the everlasting law of Jehovah, and it was the transgression of that [law] that brought the fall of man.

Here it says, "And if thou draw out thy soul to the hungry." What is this hungering? If there is not a hungering, a starving for the word of God, tell me? Then he says, "Then shall thy light rise in obscurity, and thy darkness be as the noonday: And the Lord shall guide thee continually, and satisfy thy soul in drought, and make fat thy bones: and thou shalt be like a watered garden, and like a spring of water, whose waters fail not." Why, in living connection with the God of heaven we are drawing our support from the heavenly fountain.

"And they that be of thee shall build." Oh, there is something to build! "And they that be of thee shall build the old waste places, thou shalt raise up the foundation of many generations." What is that? It is the law of Jehovah. They have been broken down, and somebody must build them up! "And they shall be called the repairer of the breach," what breach? In the law of God. It has been trampled under foot of man, and it must be built up. Do you suppose God will see His work all spoiled and not be lashed into a fury about it? Why, He will set everything in heaven to work to accomplish His purpose.

And they shall be called the repairer of the breach. Who has made a breach? Why, Satan, and he has been teaching that Christ came to abolish the law. But what did he come to do? To magnify it and make it honorable. And they shall be called the repairer of the breach. Who has been making a breach? The man of sin. He has said the fourth commandment was changed. But Christ came to make up the breach.

"If thou turn away thy foot from the sabbath, from doing thy pleasure on my holy day; and call the sabbath a delight, the holy of the Lord, honorable; and shall honor him, not doing thine own ways, nor finding thine own pleasure, nor speaking thine own words: Then shalt thou delight thyself in the Lord; and I will cause thee to ride upon the high places of the earth, and feed thee with the heritage of Jacob thy father: for the mouth of the Lord hath spoken it."

Well now, where is the breach made? In the law of God. Who has been making it? The man of sin. Now, shall we follow him or shall we follow those who are making it up? There are some who are making it up. They have picked out that commandment which says that God made the world in six days and rested on the seventh, and [they] say it doesn't make any difference which day you keep. But

we have decided that it is best to be among the obedient. But there has been a breach made, and who is going to help to make up the breach? We call upon you in the name of the Lord God of heaven and ask you to help make it up. We are not afraid to stand before the whole world and ask you to help make up that breach that has been made in the law of the Lord God, Jehovah.

We have not come here at this time to tell you it makes no difference whether you keep the law of God or not. It makes every difference, and we want to be obedient to the law of Jehovah, and we want to be in that position, raising up, what? The foundation of many generations. Who has broken it down? The man of sin. And we don't want to be upon his side, but among those who are repairers of the breach which has been made in the law of Jehovah. This is the foundation of heaven and earth, and we will be loyal and true to it if we are loyal and true to the God of heaven.

The law of Jehovah is the foundation of many generations, and we want to be found the repairers of the breach which the man of sin has made. What was the breach made in? The law of God. And what are we to lift up? The law of Jehovah, which is the foundation of many generations. This is our work, and if you can tell of a better work for us to engage in which will honor God more, we will take that work, but we intend to be loyal to the God of heaven. We expect the truth will meet with disfavor, but is it best for us to obey God or to listen to man?

We have decided that it is best to listen to God and raise up the foundation of many generations. And what is it? The law of God! Lift it up; and we calculate to do it as long as

God gives us breath. But in lifting it up we find it doesn't agree with everybody; but the question is, On whose side are you? Are you on the side of God, the side of those who are going to be repairers of the breach, the restorers of paths to dwell in, or on the side of those who are tearing it down?

We have chosen to be true, because it is best every time, and if we are in a minority here below, we are on the side of God, and God is a majority every time. Let me be in harmony with the heavenly host, then let the enemy throw out his bitterness and wrath as he ever has done. I will be loyal and true to God's commandments. But if there are those who want to go in the other way and risk it, we don't want to risk it. We have decided not to be transgressors of God's law. We have decided to obey and live, and there is no power that can interpose between us and the God of heaven. We have decided to keep His law as the apple of the eye. Is the eye tender? We know it is; we know there cannot be a speck that gets into the eye without it pains the whole body, and we want to be just as loyal to the Lord as we would preserve the eye.

I have been in this work for the last forty-five years, and I have been doing-what? Raising up the foundation of many generations. "Thou shalt be called the repairer of the breach." What breach? There has been made a breach in the law of God, the fourth commandment dropped right out, makes no difference what day you keep! It does make every difference! And we have decided to keep His law as the apple of our eye. We keep our eyes carefully, and we want them to see as God sees, and we want to work in the line God works. How long have

we been engaged in this work? Many, many years and we have been trying to raise up the foundation of many generations.

"Thou shalt be called the repairer of the breach, the restorer of paths to dwell in. If thou turn away thy foot from the Sabbath." All the men in creation may say the Sabbath is of no account; shall we believe them, or God? We have decided to believe God. I have been engaged in this work for the last forty-five years, what doing? Making up the breach. Who has made a breach? The man of sin. Now, men may raise up all the combativeness they please, but the commandments of God are the commandments of God still.

We have decided to keep God's commandments and live, and His law as the apple of our eye. Let men rail out against the law of God, and trample His commandment-keeping people under their feet. Can they do it? It is impossible. God has His measurement of character, and it is those who obey Him that live and those who keep His law as the apple of their eye that He preserves. Now if we want to preserve the apple of the eye, you see how careful we are of it, and that law is to be preserved as the apple of the eye.

"If thou turn away thy foot from the Sabbath." Then God has a Sabbath. What day is it? The one He rested upon in the beginning after He had worked six days. There is no other. "And call the Sabbath a delight, the holy of the Lord, honorable; and shalt honor him, not doing thine own ways (breaking the Sabbath), nor finding thine own pleasure, nor speaking thine own words." Then shalt thou act mournful and sorrowful? No indeed. "Then shalt thou delight thyself in the Lord." Well it must be now, right here in this world, right

here in the conflict, and we will be kept as the apple of His eye right here.

"And I will cause thee to ride upon the high places of the earth, and feed thee with the heritage of Jacob thy father: for the mouth of the Lord hath spoken it." There it is. We take the words from God. We will let men do their work, but our work will be to keep the commandments of God, stand upon this eternal basis, and raise up the foundation of many generations. We are to keep His commandments and live, and His law as the apple of the eye, notwithstanding Satan is arrayed against it.

I know God is on our side, and the angels are on our side. We have ten thousand times ten thousand, and thousands of thousands of angels that are engaged in this work to help

to make up the breach. "If thou turn away thy foot from the Sabbath, from doing thy pleasure on my holy day," that is God's day, the one He instituted in Eden. Now we calculate to worship God upon His holy day, and we thank God it is our privilege to help to make up the breach. Who will unite with us? We are not ashamed of the work. We commenced this work in the name of the Lord God of Israel, and we will not be ashamed of it. 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The World's Conversion a Fable

It is natural to the human heart to cherish that belief which is agreeable to its own selfish feelings and desires. That which promises temporal good is ardently desired by the carnal mind. Mankind have always loved to hear prophecies of good concerning themselves; and this demand for smooth things is the great secret of the thriving business, and unequaled success, of false prophets and teachers in all ages of the world.

The faith that a world of sinners, growing worse and worse with the Bible in their hands, and its increasing light flashing in their eyes (if they do not close them), are, in fact, growing better, and are on the very threshold of conversion to God, and that righteousness is about to run down our streets like rivers, as naturally as the waters of Niagara pour over the precipice, is a most soothing and comfortable faith to those who are disposed to be lulled to sleep in an easy position, where they may, in their pleasant dreams, imagine they witness the truth of the saying of the blind watchmen and false shepherds, "To-morrow shall be as this day, and much more abundant." Isa. Ivi. [Isa. 56:12] Men, in general, desire the plan of salvation to be just wide enough to take them in without any special change; and next to the doctrine of universal salvation, as a somniferous potion with which to quiet the nerves of sinners, in the church and out, is the teaching that the narrow way to life is growing broader and broader, or that the multitude in the broad way are becoming so much better than ancient sinners were, that they are about to enter the narrow way as a matter of course.

No one should give currency to a

doctrine of this nature - a doctrine so well calculated to flatter those whose affections are riveted to the present world - without the best of evidence that it is true. Yet it is taken without evidence, and handed about without any apparent sense of responsibility. The present condition of the most highly favored and enlightened portions of mankind, so far from giving signs of the conversion of the world, justify the predictions of Scripture, that "in the last days perilous times shall come," that "evil men and seducers shall wax worse and worse", that "because iniquity shall abound, the love of many shall grow cold", etc.; and consequently unless the conversion of the world is most clearly taught in the sacred word, it is not deserving of the least confidence.

That there is a future glory for the earth, is true. Nothing is more clearly revealed. But the question is, When? Is it before the second coming of Christ, or after? Is it before the resurrection of the saints to immortality, or after? Is it before the present earth and elements melt with fervent heat in the "day of judgment and perdition of ungodly men", or afterward? There will certainly be a time when "the earth shall be full of the knowledge of the Lord, as the waters cover the sea", when the "people also shall be all righteous", and "shall inherit the land forever", and "the inhabitant shall not say, I am sick" - in short, when the "tabernacle of God", having descended from Heaven, shall be with men, "and God shall wipe away all tears from their eyes; and there shall be no more death, neither sorrow, nor crying, neither shall there be any more pain; for the former things" shall have "passed away". Will any of these

things be realized during the present dispensation?

Ignorance of the clearly-revealed assurance that the people of God shall, in their glorified state, "inherit the earth and dwell therein forever", has led many to think that those promises of future glory on earth are to be fulfilled in the last days of the gospel dispensation. They have thought it must be so, because of the erroneous idea that after the advent of Christ and the judgment, the Lord would have no further use for the earth, but would burn it up; having transported the saints to some ethereal heaven, and consigned the wicked to an eternal hell, in some unknown part of the universe, created for the express purpose of eternal torture. Thus from ignorance of the plainly-revealed doctrine of the destiny of the earth as marked out in prophecy, making it the place of recompense both to the righteous and the wicked, the way has been opened for fables to multiply, some of which, from a false stand-point, have a show of Bible proof. Of this class is the doctrine under consideration; but when viewed from the true standpoint, it will be found to have not the slightest foundation in the word of God.

The first proof I adduce is the fact that, at the second coming of Christ, the world will be found in a condition similar to that of the antediluvian world at the time of the flood. If they were all righteous, having been converted by the labors of Noah, "a preacher of righteousness", such will be the case with those living in the close of the gospel dispensation; and of course none will flee to the rocks and mountains to hide from the presence of the Lamb. In such case it cannot be a "day of wrath", for the Lord Jesus cannot "be revealed from heaven in flaming fire, taking vengeance on those that know not

God, and obey not the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ;", because none of this evil character can be found upon earth, the whole world having been previously converted to God.

"But as the days of Noe were, so shall also the coming of the Son of man be. For as in the days that were before the flood they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, until the day that Noe entered into the ark, and knew not until the flood came, and took them all away; so shall also the coming of the Son of man be." Matt. Xxiv, [24]: 37-39. "Even thus shall it be in the day when the Son of man is revealed." Luke xvii, [17]: 30.

This proof is too plain and positive to need an argument. Before the flood men had been going from bad to worse, till Jehovah could bear with them no longer; therefore he brought the flood, as an apostle says, "upon the world of the ungodly". These testimonies being true, the mass of mankind will be ungodly at the time of the second advent.

It may be said, in reply to this, that Satan, who will have been bound during the thousand years of the triumph of the church in the conversion of the world, will be loosed for a little season, and deceive and overthrow the mass of them that had been godly for a thousand years; and this accounts for the world's being found, at the advent, in the same ungodly state of those in the days of Noah.

Those who will read Rev. xx [20] with care, will find that the first resurrection, in which all the "blessed and holy" come forth to "live and reign with Christ a thousand years", takes place at the time when Satan is bound; and the rest of the dead, the wicked, "live not again until the thousand years are finished." These, being raised from the dead at the

time when Satan is loosed, are the subjects of his deceptive power, till fire comes down from God out of Heaven and devours them. But this "second death hath no power" upon those that had part in the first resurrection, those who lived and reigned with Christ during the thousand years. Not one falls away from that blessed and holy number. Those that are deceived by Satan after the two resurrections, are those that were the subjects of his deceptive power in this life. Some have said that this vast multitude, "the number of whom is as the sand of the sea", are the children that will be born to the righteous during the thousand years. But it seems to me that it would detract greatly from the glory and blessedness of that triumphant period, for the people of God to know that, at its close, their children would be cut down before their eyes by fire from Heaven.

But we have seen that the first resurrection takes place when Satan is bound, at the beginning of the thousand years. This resurrection does not take place till the personal advent of Christ. "For the Lord himself shall descend from Heaven with a shout, with the voice of the archangel, and with the trump of God; and the dead in Christ shall rise first; then we which are alive and remain shall be caught up together with them in the clouds, to meet the Lord in the air, and so shall we ever be with the Lord." 1 Thess. Iv, [4]: 16, 17. This text, in connection with Rev. xx, proves that the resurrection, to "reign with Christ", or to "ever be with the Lord", takes place at the personal advent of Christ, when the Lord himself shall descend from Heaven. This is the time, and not a thousand years after ward, that the mass of men will be found ungodly, as in the days of Noah. And as the flood "took them all away" so these will all be

slain in that great day of the wrath of God and of the Lamb, and after lying dead for a thousand years, during which the earth will be desolate of men, the saints, immortal and glorified, having been taken away to reign with Christ in Heaven a thousand years, they will come up in the second resurrection to meet their final doom in the lake of fire.

It is at the second advent that, probation having closed, the saints are rewarded with immortality. "Thou shalt be recompensed at the resurrection of the just." Luke xiv, [14]: 14. It is then that the people of God are changed from corruptible to incorruptible, and from mortal to immortal, according to Paul in 1 Cor. Xv [9:25]; and, having received the gift of God which is eternal life, they will be for ever safe, for ever with the Lord; first in Heaven for a thousand years, then, returning to earth, witness the final conflagration in which the wicked are cut off (the earth is "reserved unto fire against the day of judgment and perdition of ungodly men" 2 Pet. Iii, [3]: 7. "When the wicked are cut off, thou shalt see it." Ps. Xxxvii, [37]: 34.), and, lastly, enter upon the glorious inheritance of the renovated earth and "dwell therein" and "reign for ever and ever." Rev. xxii, [22]: 5.

But the mass of mankind will be found unconverted, at the coming of Christ, and will remain unconverted Still; for he comes to reward every man according as his work shall be. Rev. xxii, [22]: 11 12. How fearfully deceptive then is the doctrine that the whole world will be converted before the coming of Christ!

Real Liberty

Have you ever experienced or heard of a conversation similar to this:

"Hey, buddy. Want to go grab a smoke?" "No thanks. I don't smoke anymore." "Okay, later do you want to go grab a couple of drinks, decompress, get a little buzz on?" "No thanks. I don't drink anymore." "Hey. That movie sequel hits the screens this weekend – you know, the one that is action-packed, lots of shooting up, great looking women, ... do you want pick a time and go see it?" "No thanks. I don't like watching those types of movies anymore." "Huh. That's interesting. So, next weekend we're having a crab fest. My buddy has scored us tons of crabs to eat at a good price. Want to come over for some crabs and beer?" "Sorry, but I don't eat shell fish anymore." "Well, Monday night the big game is on. We can call the guys over and have a sports party?" "In all honesty, I'm not much into sports anymore." "Okay, what's going on?" "Well, ever since I began to understand from the Bible what a true Christian is like, I have given up all of those things." "What??? Bro, I'm a Christian, too, you know. Are you putting yourself under bondage? Are you trying to work your way to Heaven? Christ has liberated us from all those restrictive rules. Come on, enjoy life as God intended us to do!"

Many Christians think that Jesus has set us at liberty to enjoy life, being pleasant to one another is understandable, but if the gospel is shared there is only one requirement – just believe. To keep the commandments, to keep God's Word, it is vastly believed that it is unnecessary to put on any

restrictions, especially since we are all saved and cannot be lost.

What does the Bible teach about this concept called Christian liberty?

The first half of Psalms 119:45 states, "And I will walk at liberty". Here is our first encounter of what appears to be freedom to do whatever, and it is even found in the Old Testament. That is pointed out because many think that the Old Testament was restrictive, but the New Testament is liberating. However, the second half of Psalms 119:45 states, "for I seek thy precepts." That means that the closer the precepts or rules are followed, the more at liberty a person actually happens to become.

As we move forward through the Bible, we see the mission of Christ in Isaiah 61:1, which says, "The Spirit of the Lord GOD [is] upon me; because the LORD hath anointed me to preach good tidings unto the meek; he hath sent me to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives, and the opening of the prison to [them that are] bound." Luke 4:18 confirms this as Jesus applied it to Himself. Now, focusing on the liberating, both verses point to the fact that the captives are the ones needing to be liberated. That raises the question of, "Captive to what?" Although, this next verse that we are going to share in answer to that question explicitly states "silly women", it is very helpful to understand what people are captive to by focusing on just that part. And it is not cruel tyrants holding people captive or even kidnappers. "For of this sort are they which creep into houses, and lead captive silly women laden with sins, led away with divers

lusts, Ever learning, and never able to come to the knowledge of the truth." (2 Timothy 3:6-7). Captivity involves sinning and lusts.

So, when we sin, that is when we lose our liberty; that is when we are held in captivity. Jesus did not come, die, and rise again so that we can be careless regarding sin, no matter how insignificant we may think they are. In fact, we see another connection at the end of the verse that should cause us to recall the words of Jesus: "And ye shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free" (John 8:32). Now, catch the words right before these most quoted words: "If ye continue in my word, [then] are ye my disciples indeed" (John 8:31). It is not a knowledge of the truth that makes one free, at liberty, pulled out of captivity, but it is those that continue to obey, to live according to God's Word.

Now, back on Luke 4:18 for a moment, the words are stated as, "The Spirit of the Lord [is] upon me, because he hath anointed me to preach the gospel to the poor; he hath sent me to heal the brokenhearted, to preach deliverance to the captives, and recovering of sight to the blind, to set at liberty them that are bruised." Sin bruises. And "sin is the transgression of the law" (1 John 3:4). Therefore, as the commandments are broken, we are being bruised and are being brought into captivity of which Jesus is trying to set us free, relieve us of its burdens.

When a person lies, it bruises the other person because he is losing out on what the truth would have revealed. Additionally, the liar is bruised because he now has the extra burden of making sure the lie does not get out.

When a person steals, the one who

the person stole from is now bruised in that he either must do without the stolen object, or has to spend his money again to replace it. The thief is bruised because he has to make sure the knowledge of the theft does not get out, among other bruises.

When angry words, hurtful actions, or even outright killing happens, obviously the victim is bruised mentally, physically, or even both, or has even lost his life. The one who did those things has become bruised because the relationship becomes broken, and possibly severe consequences must be faced.

And Jesus confirms that we are on the right track: "They answered him, We be Abraham's seed, and were never in bondage to any man: how sayest thou, Ye shall be made free? Jesus answered them, Verily, verily, I say unto you, Whosoever committeth sin is the servant of sin" (John 8:33-34). Sin or the transgression (breaking) of any of God's commandments, even in the slightest, is not liberating, but bondage and captivity to Satan. That is what we need to be set free from.

In fact, here is a parable on just that... Matthew 12:29 states, "Or else how can one enter into a strong man's house, and spoil his goods, except he first bind the strong man? and then he will spoil his house." The strong man is Satan. His goods are all souls held in bondage to sin. The person binding Satan is Jesus, Who came to set the captives free.

Romans 8:21 expands upon this theme of breaking the commandments actually bruises and brings people into captivity, even into bondage. "Because the creature itself also shall be delivered from the bondage of corruption into the glorious liberty of the children of God." As we break the commandments, that action creates

corruption. The mind is corrupted more and more as it witnesses, or views, that which is sinful. The body is corrupted when it partakes in those things that are sinful as well. Mental and physical corruption occurs when people think a certain activity is part of dating and then move on to another partner. We even corrupt ourselves by breaking the relationship with God in ignoring the first four commandments and not following them as He said to do them.

Cain got in trouble for making slight adjustments in that area. Did Cain have an altar? Yes. Did he make an offering? Yes. Did he try to worship the true God? Yes. Was it an animal sacrifice? No. So, likewise, we ought to be very careful about altering those first four commandments and truly "deny himself, and take up his cross, and follow me" (Matthew 16:24). To follow Jesus is to obey Him.

According to 2 Corinthians 3:17-18, we are at liberty more and more as we change from our sinful nature into the divine nature: "Now the Lord is that Spirit: and where the Spirit of the Lord [is], there [is] liberty. But we all, with open face beholding as in a glass the glory of the Lord, are changed into the same image from glory to glory, [even] as by the Spirit of the Lord." In fact, to accomplish this change of nature, divine power is granted to us: "According as his divine power hath given unto us all things that [pertain] unto life and godliness, through the knowledge of him that hath called us to glory and virtue: Whereby are given unto us exceeding great and precious promises: that by these ye might be partakers of the divine nature, having escaped the corruption that is in the world through lust" (2 Peter 1:3-4). So, what the world offers us as mental and physical degradation, we can escape from it, be at liberty, be

set free from it by turning from the participation of those things, like alcohol, entertainment, gluttony, foods that are body-destroying, and more.

Taken properly, we can also see upholding the Ten Commandments is liberating in the Book of Galatians. "For, brethren, ye have been called unto liberty; only [use] not liberty for an occasion to the flesh, but by love serve one another. For all the law is fulfilled in one word, [even] in this; Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself" (Galatians 5:13-14). Taking the words "Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself", we end up hearing Jesus saying the similar words, "Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind. This is the first and great commandment. And the second [is] like unto it, Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself" (Matthew 22:37-39). So, either Paul is feeding up Jesus' words to us or these are two separate statements inspired of God saying the same thing; but either way, they are saying to love our neighbors as ourselves. Now, listen to what Jesus said next, "On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets" (Matthew 22:40). The two commandments are not left to us to vaguely figure out how to love God and love our neighbor. Jesus basically said that the Ten Commandments are a summary of the two tables of commandments. To love God is to keep the first four commandments while to love our neighbor is the keeping of the last six commandments. And in so doing, we have liberty of fellowship and we are not bound in guilt as we approach God and approach our neighbors.

Now James 1:25 tells us that liberty is guided by doing the law: "But whoso looketh into the perfect law of liberty, and continueth [therein], he being

not a forgetful hearer, but a doer of the work, this man shall be blessed in his deed." In fact, the law itself, as we do it or keep it, is liberating because we are not liberated from obedience, but we are liberated from sinning.

And just in case we may wonder what law James is referring to, we are told in James 2:10-12, "For whosoever shall keep the whole law, and yet offend in one [point], he is guilty of all. For he that said, Do not commit adultery, said also, Do not kill. Now if thou commit no adultery, yet if thou kill, thou art become a transgressor of the law. So speak ye, and so do, as they that shall be judged by the law of liberty." It is clearly the law that contains forbiddance from killing and committing adultery which points to the Ten Commandments. So, the Ten Commandments themselves are even called the Law of Liberty. Instead of thinking a person is liberated to do whatever they please, the Bible is trying to teach us that we are liberated from the effects of sin by ceasing such activity.

And so, all the ministers that are nailing the Ten Commandments to the cross, claiming that people are under grace and somehow that causes the requirements of keeping the commandments to cease, encouraging people to walk by faith

and commandment keeping is not of faith, that the Ten Commandments are legalistic, that they are Jewish, that they bring people into bondage, and every other excuse used by twisting the meaning of verses in the Bible, they are aiding and abetting the captivity of sin and the consequence thereof. "While they promise them liberty, they themselves are the servants of corruption: for of whom a man is overcome, of the same is he brought in bondage. For if after they have escaped the pollutions of the world through the knowledge of the Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, they are again entangled therein, and overcome, the latter end is worse with them than the beginning. For it had been better for them not to have known the way of righteousness, than, after they have known [it], to turn from the holy commandment delivered unto them" (2 Peter 2:19-21).

So, will you continue to listen to your preacher promising great liberty and salvation while he is discouraging obedience in keeping the commandments, or will you see that true liberation is found only in obedience to the commandments and keeping of His Word?

Can Guilt Make a Person Physically Sick?

To answer this question let us take a look at the meaning and purpose of guilt - yes, guilt does have a purpose, but guilt is quite a heavy burden, and is one we were never expected to, or designed to, carry. In Webster's 1828 Dictionary there is actually a term called "guilt-sick" with the meaning being, "Diseased in consequence of guilt", but an actual definition of just guilt as a feeling or an emotion is not available there, only the criminal usage, so my hope is these people who deal with such things might be able to help clarify the definition, even though we are all too familiar with the feeling.

From an online article entitled **What Is Guilt, According to Psychologists?**:
"Guilt is generally defined as a self-

conscious, negative feeling over wrongdoing," says Tina Malti, PhD, a professor of psychology and the director of the laboratory for social-emotional development and intervention at the University of Toronto in Mississauga, who researches guilt.

"Shame is also a negative, self-conscious feeling, but it stems from being seen as lesser in the eyes of one's peers or society at large," Dr. Malti says. We feel guilty when we have devalued others, whereas we feel shame about the possibility of others devaluing us.

Jennifer Ho, PsyD, a California-based clinical psychologist, explains another difference between the two. Guilt, she says, is a feeling about an action you did that you think was wrong —

a behavior that doesn't necessarily reflect who you are on the whole. Shame is "a sense that you as a person are wrong," she says.

That sounds very much like Webster's term – guilt-sick, which clearly explains in itself that along with guilt comes disease. So, it seems that guilt and shame are bosom buddies, both carrying tremendous weight that is surely hindering our walk with Christ. The trap that we almost always get into with guilt, which actually brings on the shame, is that most of the time we want our offense, or sin, to remain in the dark, so we cover up one sin with another and another, until we are in a convoluted mess, as Sir Walter Scott succinctly stated in his writings, "Oh what a tangled web we weave, when first we practice to deceive." Remember Adam and Eve in the Garden of Eden after they had committed sin, they actually tried to hide from God, to deceive Him, and humanity is still doing the same thing today, many times en-mass which not only damages individuals, but can, and does, eventually take down entire civilizations rife with complete disregard for the law; all brought about by degraded humanity in bondage to their own unconfessed sin.

Lying seems to be at the root of most guilt, and there is simply nothing good to say about lying. Proverbs 12:22 states, "Lying lips [are] abomination to the LORD:"

What we fail to realize in this conundrum is that not depending on the only One who can save us is simply unbelief, and cherished

unbelief brings worry to the soul; when we worry we are actually denying the power of Christ. This is a serious offense. Matthew 10:33 tells us that if we deny Him, "him will I also deny before my Father which is in heaven." The only way to lift this burden of guilt from our souls is to give it to Jesus – He died to take all of our burdens away so we can have health and vital force. He, Who is fully able, is our burden bearer.

The purpose of guilt and its remedy are rolled into one package. Guilt is not to make us run and hide in shame, its purpose is to bring us to repentance, to free us of that burden of sin so we can be whole again; when sin threatens to take over the mastery of your soul, and burdens the conscience, turn to the only One who can help. We are no different than the sick man lying on his mat at the pool at Bethesda, our guilt from sin has made us physically sick and

too paralyzed to help ourselves. We have to reach up, up from this world of Satan's and grasp the hand of Jesus in His realm for complete healing.

The first stanza of the hymn, He touched Me, written by Bill Gaither many years ago pretty much says it all:

Shackled by a heavy burden,

'Neath a load of guilt and shame.

Then the hand of Jesus touched me,

And now I am no longer the same.

Guilt and shame shackle us. Let us turn from anything that causes disease in our bodies. If we are bringing sickness or burdens of any kind upon ourselves, then we are disobeying God, but obeying Satan, whose goal is to destroy God's people.

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How Do You Resolve It?

It is one thing to know some verses that help a person stay in the faith, but it is another thing to know the Word in such a way that when a verse seems contradictory to know how to resolve it. True Seventh-day Adventists do not ignore verses. It is our hope that this section will help answer some of those challenges that we may come across personally or be used by others against our beliefs.

Do We Keep the Commandments or Not

Matthew 19:17 And he said unto him, Why callest thou me good? [there is] none good but one, [that is], God: but if thou wilt enter into life, keep the commandments.

Romans 3:28 Therefore we conclude that a man is justified by faith without the deeds of the law.

When Jesus was asked, "Good Master, what good thing shall I do, that I may have eternal life?" (Matthew 19:16), Jesus answered, "Why callest thou me good? [there is] none good but one, [that is], God: but if thou wilt enter into life, keep the commandments" (Matthew 19:17). Clearly, Jesus was referring to the Ten Commandments as He started to rattle them off: "Thou shalt do no murder, Thou shalt not commit adultery, Thou shalt not steal, Thou shalt not bear false witness, honour thy father and [thy] mother: and, Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself" (Matthew 19:18-19). It really looks like Jesus told the gentleman, and us indirectly, that it is expected that we keep the Ten Commandments to be saved.

Then Paul flatly declares not once but twice that "we conclude that a man is justified by faith without the deeds of the law" (Romans 3:28) and "Therefore by the deeds of the law there shall no flesh be justified in his sight: for by the law [is] the knowledge of sin" (Romans 3:20).

Most Christians look at the commandments from just two sides; either we keep them to be saved or they are mere suggestions or even nailed to the cross as we are already saved. Both understandings are in error, but those views pit Jesus against Paul, and as "God is not [the author] of confusion" (1 Corinthians 14:33), we have to find a way that will cause both verses to be in agreement.

And we find it in Paul's writings. "For not the hearers of the law [are] just before God, but the doers of the law shall be justified" (Romans 2:13). That is very similar to what Jesus stated and that should trigger a prior article on this subject that pitted Romans 2:13 against Romans 3:28, and for that matter, Romans 3:20. That resolution on the apparent contradiction was provided in the September 2019 issue and is the answer here as well.

Basically, the third option that ought to be considered is that true Christians keep the Ten Commandments as a fruit of being saved and not a means to be saved.

A married woman is not going to prepare meals that her ex-boyfriend enjoys but the current husband

hates. She is going to make meals that the husband enjoys. And the same is true with the commandments. Committing sin is doing what the ex-boyfriend, Satan, loves. Keeping the commandments is what pleases Jesus.

Therefore, by Jesus stating that if a person wants eternal life, they are to keep the commandments and even be a doer of the law, as Paul wrote, all the while realizing that not one commandment kept can justify us or

save us. All the saving has been done by Jesus, but He is not going to automatically give salvation to everyone, though He offers it to all. He gives it to those choosing to keep the law but have fallen short. He then by His own merits justifies that person and even "cleanse us from all unrighteousness" (1 John 1:9) as well as "present [you] faultless before the presence of his glory" (Jude 1:24).

Authorized KJV vs Catholic Bible

If you are using anything but the KJV, you are using a Catholic influenced Bible, which strategically twists and leaves out key words and verses so as to make even the ecumenical movement between religions outside of Christianity possible. And Ellen White does identify not to use them for reliability: "Wycliffe's Bible had been translated from the Latin text, which contained many errors." {GC 245.1}. Latin is Catholic or which most modern versions rely upon.

Are You Chosen, or Is Not Necessary to Be Chosen?

Many of us can finish off Matthew 20:16 by memory, or is there nothing to finish off? It goes like "So the last shall be first, and the first last", and then is it "for many be called, but few chosen", or nothing at all? The implication of leaving it off is that we all go to Heaven, but just rearrange positions. Other versions indicate that a person is chosen and that of the many who are called, only a few respond. But that would imply responsibility upon the believer, and modern Christianity which believes that Jesus did it all just cannot have that. They believe there is no responsibility upon the believer, and in fact, every person actually gets to go. Admittedly, most versions do acknowledge Matthew 22:14, which

states the words, "For many are called, but few [are] chosen."
Therefore, we conclude that the versions that drop these words from Matthew 20:16 are in error and it affects salvation.

King James Version: "So the last shall be first, and the first last: for many be called, but few chosen."

In Error:

American Standard Version: So the last shall be first, and the first last.

Amplified Bible: So those who are last [in this world] shall be first [in the world to come], and those who are first, last."

Berean Literal Bible: Thus the last

will be first, and the first, last."

Berean Study Bible: So the last will be first, and the first will be last."

Christian Standard Bible: "So the last will be first, and the first last."

Contemporary English Version: Jesus then said, "So it is. Everyone who is now last will be first, and everyone who is first will be last."

English Revised Version: So the last shall be first, and the first last.

English Standard Version: So the last will be first, and the first last."

Godbey New Testament: So the last shall be first, and first last.

GOD'S WORD® Translation: "In this way the last will be first, and the first will be last."

Good News Translation: And Jesus concluded, "So those who are last will be first, and those who are first will be last."

Holman Christian Standard Bible: "So the last will be first, and the first last."

Mace New Testament: thus the last shall be first, and the first last: for though many are invited, few have precedence.

NET Bible: So the last will be first, and the first last."

New American Standard Bible: So the last shall be first, and the first, last."

New International Version: "So the last will be first, and the first will be last."

New Living Translation: "So those who are last now will be first then, and those who are first will be last."

Weymouth New Testament: "So the last shall be first, and the first last."

Worrell New Testament: So the last shall be first, and the first last.

Correct, This Time:

A Faithful Version: So the last shall be first, and the first shall be last; for many are called, but few are chosen."

Anderson New Testament: So the last shall be first, and the first last. For many are called, but few are chosen.

Aramaic Bible in Plain English: So the last will be first and the first last, for the called are many and the chosen ones are few."

Bishops' Bible of 1568: So the last, shalbe the first, & the first shalbe last: For many be called, but fewe be chosen.

Catholic Public Domain Version: So then, the last shall be first, and the first shall be last. For many are called, but few are chosen."

Coverdale Bible of 1535: So the last shalbe the first, & the first the last. For many are called, but few are chosen.

Darby Bible Translation: Thus shall the last be first, and the first last; for many are called ones, but few chosen ones.

Questions And Answers

Jerry O'Donnell

Allow at least three (3) months before your question may appear.

QUESTION: With Ted Wilson still in office, is that considered healthy for our church?

ANSWER: "The Lord works in a mysterious way His wonders to perform. The Lord does not design that one man shall be president of our conferences more than two years in succession. [One] year would be better; [and] then let him not be placed in some conference to take charge, but let him act in a common capacity, as a minister, to preach the Word. It is dangerous to the spiritual experience to have one man year [after] year as president of the General Conference or even of State conferences" {Ms109-1893}.

QUESTION: Although there is forgiveness, when people just do not get along, are we forced to be in each other's company?

ANSWER: In most of those situations, there is something disagreeable and clashing with another person, though not considered sinful. Both may keep the Sabbath holy; both may pay tithe; in fact, both may do all that is expected in the eyes of God but still not get along.

Jesus Himself "called unto [him] his twelve disciples" (Matthew 10:1), keeping in mind that one of them would betray Him (Luke 6:16). Do realize, that "the Lord appointed other seventy also" (Luke 10:1), yet these seventy remained closer to Jesus than all the other believers. Even of them, "Jesus taketh [with him] Peter, and James, and John" (Mark 9:2). Still further yet, Jesus had

a closer relationship with John, of whom He trusted His mother with: "Then saith he to the disciple, Behold thy mother! And from that hour that disciple took her unto his own [home]" (John 19:27). For whatever reason, some times personalities do clash.

In the case of Jesus, He did not invite all seventy or others to enlarge the core of twelve disciples. He also favored the home of Lazarus, Mary, and Martha (Luke 10:38-42) over other people's homes to be refreshed. However, Jesus did not keep his distance from Judas despite being the traitor and Jesus knowing it. He always looked for that opportunity to reach the soul.

Keep in mind that Jesus did pray, "Neither pray I for these alone, but for them also which shall believe on me through their word; That they all may be one; as thou, Father, [art] in me, and I in thee, that they also may be one in us: that the world may believe that thou hast sent me" (John 17:20-21). This seems to point out that mere toleration of one another instead of pressing together is not in the best interest of fulfilling this verse.

But, there is something to being incompatible in a personality way. One person may be very talkative while another is not. One person may be very outgoing while another is not. One person may be at a higher level of understanding in which a person in the faith for more than fifty years is going to know a whole lot more than a person in the church for a year or two. This level of knowledge

difference can be challenging to navigate.

In general, if we have no animosity towards another and they have no animosity towards us, then some times, like in the case of Mark and Paul, a separation is necessary, hopefully for the allowance of time to make things right. "And some days after Paul said unto Barnabas, Let us go again and visit our brethren in every city where we have preached the word of the Lord, [and see] how they do. And Barnabas determined to take with them John, whose surname was Mark. But Paul thought not good to take him with them, who departed from them from Pamphylia, and went not with them to the work. And the contention was so sharp between them, that they departed asunder one from the other: and so Barnabas took Mark, and sailed unto Cyprus; And Paul chose Silas, and departed, being recommended by the brethren unto the grace of God. And he went through Syria and Cilicia, confirming the churches" (Acts 15:36-41).

The goal is to be unified, but nonsinful reasons to separate may still come up and there is nothing wrong with keeping the distance so as to keep the peace before sin does enter, especially when issues get sharp, as long as there is an allowance for future opportunity to try again.

QUESTION: All the suffering that I am personally going through in all aspects of life as I age, is there a purpose? And please do not tell me that it is character growth.

ANSWER: So, we shall not point towards character growth, but we shall point you to 2 Corinthians 4:6, which says "For God, who commanded the light to shine out of darkness, hath shined in our hearts, to [give] the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ."

Basically, not everything is for our learning and growth. Many times, others watch to see how we conduct

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ourselves while people are fully aware of what faith we profess. "Ye [are] my witnesses, saith the LORD, and my servant whom I have chosen: that ye may know and believe me, and understand that I [am] he: before me there was no God formed, neither shall there be after me" (Isaiah 43:10).

So, ask yourself what the nurses and other staff members are observing. Through much pain and suffering, am I glorifying God or am I so focused within that I do not care how my witness is, be it to other patients, nurses, doctors, visitors, etc.?

QUESTION: After creating man in Genesis 1, what is meant by "not a man to till the ground" in Genesis 2?

Genesis 2:5 states, "And every plant of the field before it was in the earth, and every herb of the field before it grew: for the LORD God had not caused it to rain upon the earth, and

[there was] not a man to till the ground."

The focus is not to be placed upon the man existing but rather upon the activity to be performed. Sure, "God created man in his [own] image, in the image of God created he him; male and female created he them" (Genesis 1:27), but before sin, there was no need to till the ground. That does not come in until after the fall of mankind into sin. Genesis 3:19 states, "In the sweat of thy face shalt thou eat bread, till thou return unto the ground; for out of it wast thou taken: for dust thou [art], and unto dust shalt thou return." And Genesis 3:23 explicitly tells us "Therefore the LORD God sent him forth from the garden of Eden, to till the ground from whence he was taken".

Overall, it was Moses' way, the writer of Genesis, to state that sin had not yet entered into this world when reading Genesis 2.

The Resurrections

The word is plural because there is more than just one resurrection. Jesus said, "Marvel not at this: for the hour is coming, in the which all that are in the graves shall hear his voice, and shall come forth; they that have done good, unto the resurrection of life; and they that have done evil, unto the resurrection of damnation" (John 5:28-29).

Now, the question some have is that, are these resurrections at different times, or at the same time.

At the event described by Jesus, Paul gives us some details. "For the Lord himself shall descend from heaven with a shout, with the voice of the archangel, and with the trump of God: and the dead in Christ shall rise first: Then we which are alive [and] remain shall be caught up together with them in the clouds, to meet the Lord in the air: and so shall we ever be with the Lord" (1 Thessalonians 4:16-17). Only the saved that died come forth at the second coming, for they are "in Christ". And the purpose of this resurrection is to "ever be

with the Lord". That fully describes Jesus' first reference as being "the resurrection of life", meaning, it is eternal life, seeing the term "ever be" means just that.

Then John identifies the second resurrection which is for damnation. He does so by labeling the one as the "first resurrection", which was already addressed, and the second resurrection as being for "the rest of the dead". "And I saw thrones, and they sat upon them, and judgment was given unto them: and [I saw] the souls of them that were beheaded for the witness of Jesus, and for the word of God, and which had not worshipped the beast, neither his image, neither had received [his] mark upon their foreheads, or in their hands; and they lived and

reigned with Christ a thousand years. But the rest of the dead lived not again until the thousand years were finished. This [is] the first resurrection. Blessed and holy [is] he that hath part in the first resurrection: on such the second death hath no power, but they shall be priests of God and of Christ, and shall reign with him a thousand years" (Revelation 20:4-6).

So, at the second coming, which starts the millennium, as we discussed last month, is the first resurrection, which is for eternal life. At the conclusion of the millennium is the resurrection for the rest of the dead, known as the second resurrection, which is for damnation, known as hell.
